The joint auction held on the “first” “Tuesday” of every month, starting at “3” p.m. makes an enthusiastic event, with a total amount around NTD 28,570,000 from the highest bidding.

On November 1, 2022, the joint auction held on the “first” “Tuesday” of every month, starting at “3” p.m. was held by all branches of AEA and the public actively participated in the bids for a variety of items auctioned. The total amount made from the highest bid of the auction reached NTD 28,570,897, which would bring income to the treasury.

The highest amount made from the highest bidding of the auction of real estate properties was the land located at Guiyi Section, Pingtung City and auctioned by Pingtung Branch. The area of the land was more than 2314.06 m² and currently used as a parking lot, and the total amount made from its highest bidding was NTD 8,516,000. The one with the second highest bidding amounts were 3 lands and 1 building located at Lunghua 2 Sub-section, Gushan District, Kaohsiung City, and auctioned by Kaohsiung Branch. The total amount made from their highest bidding was NTD 4,461,000. In addition, there were 2 buildings and 2 lands located at Sanzhi District, New Taipei City and auctioned by Shihlin Branch for NTD 2,656,888; a building located at No. 479 Dingtai Road, Wufeng District, Taichung City and auctioned by Taichung Branch for NTD 1,405,000; and a land located at Lanxi Section, Xindian District, New Taipei City and auctioned by Taipei Branch for NTD 811,118. There were 5 lands located at Zhongzheng Section, Zhushan Township, Nantou County and auctioned by Changhua Branch for NTD 690,000; three lands located at Kunghsueh Section, Annan District, Tainan City and auctioned by Tainan Branch for NTD 619,000; 3 lands located at Daxia Section, Hemi Township, Changhua County and auctioned

by Changhua Branch for NTD 502,000; a land located at Changkangling Section, Yangmei District, Taoyuan City and auctioned by Taoyuan Branch for NTD 360,100; a land located at Shiniu Creek, Douliu City, Yunlin County and auctioned by Chiayi Branch for NTD 141,000, and other real properties in good locations were also auctioned with great results.

The total amount made from the highest bidding of personal properties was NTD 8,194,747. The most eye-catching and the one with the highest bids were 2 TOYOTA tractors auctioned by the Chiayi Branch for NTD 2,700,000. The one with the second highest bidding was the Taiwan red cypress auctioned by Chiayi Branch for NTD 1,325,000. Other properties auctioned by the branches included BMW automobiles, Volkswagen sedans, Kuozui passenger and cargo vans, Suzuki automobiles, Ford automobiles, Yulon automobiles, Kuozui automobiles, Honda automobiles, Nissan automobiles, Mitsubishi automobiles, ISUZU vans, and Yamaha motorcycles, all of which were sold at very competitive prices. The rest of the personal property auctioned or sold included Scotch whisky, spirits, treasure bowl artwork, Xiaomi smart bracelets, film sealers, hairdressing goods, toys, gloves, towels, stocks, as well as forklifts, excavators, crushers and many other items.

AEA reminds the public that although the Covid-19 epidemic is slowing down, it is still ongoing and should not be taken lightly. The public can participate in real property auctions more often by communication bidding methods, and avoid the risk of contracting the disease by visiting the auction venue less often. The public who goes to the branches to participate in personal property auctions should still strictly comply with all of the epidemic prevention regulations, wear masks throughout the process, and take personal epidemic prevention measures to protect the health of the citizens.
